

Treatment of Disease 2: Possible FIB Questions & T or F

FIB – Most of the FIBs are mechanisms that he mentioned in class...so if you know the mechanisms for each disease you're probably good.

- Symptoms of menopause syndrome = irregular cycles, yin deficiency signs, shen & emotional disorders, bone & joint problems, vag. Dryness & atrophy (KI def. & essence def.)
- Mastitis/Breast abscess mechanism = Blockage & heat accumulation in the yang ming channel (not an organ syndrome.)
- UTI/PUD mechanism = Excess in the UB w/def in the KI.
- Profuse vag discharge basic pts = GB 41 (Rt 1st), SJ 5 (Lt 2nd), GB 26, 27, 28, Ba liao, SP 9, ST 36, & SP 6
- Epilepsy mechanism = Rebellious Wei Qi w/ retention of phlegm and inner wind.
- Types of headaches
 - Taiyang (SI, UB) = occiput
 - Shaoyang (SJ, GB) = temporal
 - Yangming (LI, ST) = forehead
 - Jueyin (P, LV) = vertex
- MS mechanism = Blockage of Wei Qi in 8 extra channels (DU & Dai vessels.)
- Invasion of external pathogens = Wind Cold, Wind Heat, Wind Damp, Wind Dryness
- Headache symptoms = at least 5 headaches w/ similar features, lasting 4 – 72 hrs each, moderate to severe intensity, throbbing/ pulsating, initially unilateral, cyclical pattern, worse w/activity, photophobia, phonophobia, osmophobia, family history
- Difference of H.A. & Migraine = main difference is that migraine has triggers/aura
H.A. = Blockage of channels in the head
Migraine = Hyperactivity of the 5 sense organs
