# **Deficiency/Excess**

Deficiency/Excess refers to the relative strength of the pathogens and the anti-pathogenic Qi.

### **General Symptoms of Deficiency**

Common deficiency syndromes types are: yin, yang, qi, blood. More on those specifics next page

#### **Excess Syndromes**

Syndromes of excess refer to pathological conditions in which:

- 1. the pathogenic factor is hyperactive
- 2. the antipathogenic Qi remains strong

#### Reasons for excess:

- 1. External evil attacking
- 2. dysfunction of internal organs
